Dear Ms. Bickle:

Thank you for your letter to the Minister of Health and Long-Term Care about funding assistance for visual smoke detectors for the deaf, deafened and hard of hearing under the Ministry's Assistive Devices Program (ADP).

Currently, the Assistive Devices Program provides funding assistance to Ontarians who have long term disabilities for the purchase or lease of personalized devices necessary for basic day-to-day living. At present, funding is not provided for the many different types of personal safety systems available on the market, including personal "Alerts", visual smoke alarms, or for voice activated lighting, etc.

At its next meeting, proposed for August 2008, the Sensory Standing Committee will be asked to consider visual smoke detectors for the deaf, deafened and hard of hearing. This Committee provides advice and recommendations to the program regarding several matters, including devices that should be considered for funding assistance for individuals who are hearing impaired. Their review will consider questions of fit with the mandate of ADP, feasibility, technical and operational effectiveness and, if a device is being recommended, clinical criteria for eligibility.

I am advised that Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHA) administers the Residential Rehabilitation Assistance Program for Persons with Disabilities (RRAP-D) and Home Adaptations for Seniors' Independence (HASI) program. People who require financial assistance toward a specialized smoke alarm system may wish to contact CMHA directly at http://www.cmhc-schl.gc.ca/ for information about these programs. CMHA's toll free line is 1-800-704-6488. I understand CMHA does receive inquiries through the Bell Relay Service.
